

KRAVIS LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE 2007 SUMMER INTERNSHIP RESOURCE GUIDE

The Kravis Leadership Institute (KLI) continues to encourage and support summer internships for CMC students. The 2007 summer is the first time that KLI and CMC Career Services Center (CSC) will use a common application process for all sponsored summer internships. The deadline for applications is February 28, 2007. Students should visit the KLI <http://kli.claremontmckenna.edu/> and CSC web sites <http://csc.claremontmckenna.edu/> for more information. The information that follows is intended to compliment guidance and additional resources available in the CSC.

Summer internships provide students multiple opportunities to learn about and to develop personal leadership skills. Sponsored CMC internships have traditionally, though not always, focused attention on nonprofit organizations. While work in for-profit organizations offers tremendous opportunity for learning and growth, sponsored internships have served to support students working with organizations not typically able to pay interns. It can also be argued, that regardless of career ambition, a meaningful experience in a social sector organization can contribute to an increased appreciation for social responsibility.

Choosing an internship. Another valued CMC tradition is the experience of students having to develop their own internships. While some structured internships offer great experiences, the responsibility for engaging the desired organization in the development of a meaningful internship is, in itself, a valuable experience. Student reflection also supports that both students and organizations are likely to make greater efforts to enrich the experience as a result of student initiative in the development of the internship. Organizations and internship supervisors are also generally more interested in individual interns when they understand that the student is participating in an academic program that is supported by CMC.

The questions that follow can help steer the internship search:

Do I need a particular type of internship to support my career interests? Juniors, for instance, may find value in interning with organizations with which they intend to apply to be hired in the future, or may determine they need greater visibility of the profession/industry in which they intend to pursue work. Most, but not all, CMC sponsored internships involve non-profit organizations since most of these organizations are less likely to provide support to interns.

Do I 'need' or 'want' a sponsored internship? There are many non-CMC summer work opportunities and internships available, and CMC sponsored internships may not satisfy your particular interest or need. For many students, however, the opportunity to be supported, monetarily and academically in a summer internship is an important starting point for committing to finding the best possible sponsored internship.

What type of internship would help 'round-out' my experiences? Many CMC students have great previous volunteer or work experiences. A CMC sponsored summer internship should be more than a repetition of a previous experience. The expectation is that a CMC student has a great deal to

offer an organization, even for a short period of time, and that the organization will commit to providing ‘challenging’ and ‘meaningful’ work.

What type of experience would best help my self-development? Internships are a unique environment where the learning potential is limitless and the consequences relatively trivial. Is there an area in which you wish to improve your skills or confidence? If ever there is an opportunity to “stretch” oneself it may be in the appropriate internship. Many of the individuals who contribute to making these internships possible provide their support because they recognize the potential of truly life-altering experiences through internships.

Where does leadership fit in? In addition to personal leadership development, internships offer access to the ‘living laboratory’ of leadership. Every organization offers a window to exploring the individual leadership and organizational dynamics that steer that organizations success (or lack there of). The academic requirements of a sponsored internship arm every CMC student with the license to pursue both the basic and critical questions of ‘why?’. ‘Why’ does this organization exist? ‘Why’ are decisions made the way they are? ‘Why’ does my supervisor or the Director or CEO lead in the manner that they do? ‘Why’ doesn’t the organization? You get the idea. Sometimes the windows to the organization’s leadership are naturally open, other times you have to do some prying and inquiring. The student who completes an internship without having pushed on as many windows as possible has missed the opportunity that comes with being an ‘intern’.

Where do I want to spend the majority of my summer? Many students see internships as an opportunity to explore a new area or to extend experiences abroad or in Washington D.C. The good news is that quality experiences await the properly motivated CMC student nearly anywhere in the world. While some restrictions result from concerns about safety, summer internships offer a unique opportunity to experience life in another culture or community in addition to the merits of the experience within the organization. CMC sponsorship can make travel affordable.

How creative can I be? Let’s assume your passion is marketing, but none of the sponsored internships sound like marketing opportunities. Might it interest you to intern in the marketing department of a large nonprofit? Maybe in a city you haven’t experienced before? Or let’s assume you are considering a future in medicine or healthcare policy. Is there an opportunity to expand your understanding of the disciplines by serving with a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) abroad? Is there an added opportunity to improve language skills?

(Almost) Anything is possible. As the list that follows demonstrates, CMC students have received KLI support for a wide variety of experiences. CMC sponsorship has allowed some CMC students to intern in organizations that do not typically accept interns, or who welcome only graduate students. You won’t know, however, until you ask.

Several lists follow. The first is a list of organizations recognized as leading non-profit and governmental organizations. The second list includes organizations with which KLI has a history or come recommended by KLI Board members. The third set of tables list previously completed KLI internships. The CMC Career Service Center (CSC) offers additional information and resources for supporting your internship search. Be sure to review the application requirements on the CSC web site.
